In the Garden..

with Claire Pearce of Combe Dingle Nursery

As if November isn't busy enough with getting plants put away for winter, change is a foot at Combe Dingle. We are looking forward to our new neighbours. I am sure many have wondered, and now I can say, that replacing most of the farm buildings will be the new Valtra tractor dealership for C J Cox. They are already proving a pleasure (and useful!) to have around.

This made me realise I had to stop thinking about it and get on with the new shop, in the shed next to the original shop. I apologise to all those that had to wait for me to get off a scaffold tower to serve them, we've been rather busy. The new shop will be in full use before Christmas; **tree sales start on 1**st December.

Consequently, I am a little behind. But haven't we been saying that all year. With the late cold spring, frost in mid-May to now, a mild dry November. We have had some frosts, but the trees are only just changing colour and falling. Leaves should be raked off the lawn (they weaken the grass), swept off paths (slip hazard) and cleared around the house. Keep and compost the leaves to use as a mulch. Leave some leaves in corners and under heads for hedgehogs to hide.

As you probably know, I don't agree with "putting the garden to bed." We should enjoy our gardens all year round. Or agree with being too tidy. Our little patches can hold a lot of winter feed, such as seed heads and fruit, and shelter for wildlife. So maybe leave that cutting back or hedge cutting until spring.

In the vegetable garden onion, shallots, garlic, and broad beans are in. Sprouts and kallettes still need staking and I still want to experiment with autumn situ sown peas. We are picking cauliflowers and kale.

The bean poles need to be taken down and stored in the dry. I had a disappointing amount of beans this year and very few to store as pulses.

I will continue with bulb planting. There is still plenty of time. I have even planted in January, and they catch up. Maybe an idea for Christmas presents. What greater joy to look forward to than watching bees visiting early flowering bulbs in the spring sunshine.

Village Hall

By the time you receive this, we will have held our saxophone concert raising funds for the hall and our 60s evening in aid of the Beacon Centre at Musgrove Hospital, but we can't report back as at the time of writing they haven't yet taken place! Our next planned event is the Open Gardens on Sunday 26th June next year, about which you will find a separate article by Amanda Acland in this edition of Cloverleaf.

We now have a good quality working sound system in the hall, for which we are currently drawing up some simple instructions, and our heating is controlled remotely via mobile phones. Our next planned improvements are:

- (1) Replacing the main doors with a single wider double-glazed door, which will allow better disabled access and have a more secure multi-locking system. The key will be kept in a safe outside the door and the access code will be issued to users.
- (2) Installing an overhead projector to which laptops and mobile phones as well as microphones will be able to connect. This will be capable of linking to the sound system, and as well as being available for visiting speakers, will enable us to offer film nights again as the cost of running them would be significantly less than the Moviola system.

Combe Critters Baby and Toddlers

After a stop being put to the sessions run in the village hall due to COVID 19 back in early 2019, we have been pleased to re-start Combe Critters in September this year. We have had a great first two months, meeting lots of young families from the parish and surrounding areas, providing the much-needed peer support which we have all very much missed through the pandemic. We also ran an open morning in half-term, an opportunity to meet the wider community, share cake, and raise some money for the upkeep of the Meade.

We are arranging a magical Christmas event to be held in December, with some twinkly lights and lanterns planned - look out for more information on the event closer to the time.

Aimed at babies, toddlers and parents, we run the group from in the Wild Play Area at Underway Meade, courtesy of Underway Meade and Combe St Nicholas Parochial Trust. We meet outdoors all year round, making the most of the wild setting and celebrating the seasons. Inspired by the natural setting and wildlife, there are a variety of wild play activities seeking to stimulate and develop young minds, and provide a good hour of muddy, wet, messy play! This gives little ones a chance to meet others, let off some steam outdoors and have an explore of the various stations, in turn allowing parents to get out, have a chat with others, a hot drink and most importantly a piece of homemade cake!

We were lucky enough to receive some funding from the parish council to get us up and running and a grant from Somerset Community Fund to purchase the equipment required to run outdoors. Run by a group of local volunteers led by Sarah Packham, a schoolteacher who oversees organising the various play stations, we are a not-for-profit Unincorporated Association, with any profits from the group going back into the play stations and equipment, the upkeep of the Wild Play Area and the wider Underway Meade.

Underway Meade

As planned, in October, we finally managed to hold our AGM covering 2019-2020 and 2020-2021. All of the current trustees were re-elected, with the exception of Bobbie Boud who stepped down. Thanks were given to Bobbie for her hard work and support over the last few years. In her place we welcomed Stuart James.

The Combe Critters Baby and Toddlers Group held a well-attended village open event in the Meade with coffee, cake and fun activities. It was lovely to see a wide range of village residents both young and not so young meeting and enjoying themselves on a lovely sunny autumn morning. Thanks to Sarah and her hard-working team for arranging this and providing the coffee and cakes. The group has generously donated the income from the event to Underway Meade to help towards our running costs.

By the time you read this issue of Cloverleaf we hope to have completed the construction of a more wheelchair accessible path with less of a gradient that avoids the steps on the current path adjacent to the sheep field leading towards the woodland. We are pleased that the Neroche Volunteers agreed to join us to help us carry out the necessary work and hope that it will be of benefit to Meade users old and new.

On the subject of paths, you may noticed there have been some white markers sprayed onto the hard surface path near the middle gate which has been severely eroded by the regular flooding that we have suffered in the last couple of years. As I write this article, we are awaiting the delivery of some road planings which we will use to repair the surface and fill in the dips. We will also be considering how best to improve the drainage to try and prevent a repeat of the damage in future years.

As many of you will know, for the last few years we have acted as a collection point for recycled Christmas trees. Usually, the District Council staff have come and collected them or even chipped them on site for us to use. Unfortunately, due to the Covid restrictions last year they couldn't collect the trees and we attempted, unsuccessfully, to chip them ourselves. It is with regret therefore that, unless the District Council can collect this year, we won't be able to accept recycled trees this year. Watch out for posters in the Meade if the situation changes.

Lastly, special thanks to Bill for all his hard work in the last few months. He has created a new rustic bench from the ash tree branches which has been



much appreciated by regular Meade users and apparently is good for both those who are of tall and short people! He has made a great start in clearing the pond of the false watercress and leaving the debris on the edges so that any water creatures are able to safely get back into the water. He has also been preparing for the path work already mentioned above by marking out the areas we will be working on.



The Lawns, Play Area. New equipment is being looked into, namely a climbing frame and a `skywire` but at the time of writing this report, our grant application to SSDC has been refused. Other possibilities are now being checked into. The copper beech tree also needs some remedial work.

Adopt a Drain or a Ditch The recent downpours and flooding that have inundated a number of parishioners properties and some more than once, are terrible. More than a months' worth of rain in an evening is difficult to comprehend and in many ways we all feel powerless to defeat such a deluge.

However - we can all help a little. If you have a gully or drain nearby your house or on your daily walk please keep an eye on it and clear the leaves and twigs when you see it covered over – only of course, if it is safe to do so. If it is blocked and not flowing then either report it on the blocked drain web site Report a problem on the road to; somerset.gov.uk/roads-and-transport/report-a-problem-on-the-road_or_County Highways Somerset County Council on countyroads-southsom@somerset.gov.uk or report to Anne our Parish Clerk. If there is a ditch nearby that is preventing the flow of water and causing flooding then let our Parish Clerk know the details/location and we will contact the land owner. Please do not put grass cuttings/hedge clippings/garden waste into any ditch.

Information is still being obtained about help with clearing the leat/stream as so much silt/gravel has built up over the years, plus the intense rain washing it down. The responsibility for the clearing does fall on the adjoining landowner, as this part is not considered `main river` That starts on the other side of the A358 which it joins with the river coming from Chard reservoir

Now the evenings are getting darker earlier, please don't forget to take a **torch** with you when taking the dog out, so that all **dogs mess can be cleared up please**. A fluorescent coat/strip is also a good safety precaution for you and another one for your dog/horse.

The next Parish Council meeting will be held on Monday 24th January 2022, 7.30pm in the Village Hall. No meeting in December.

Geoff and a Drinker in the Garden — really?

Last year I published a couple of items in Cloverleaf, one on wildlife in the community and another on moths. As we approach the end of 2021, perhaps

a follow-up is in order.

It's been a good year for moths, despite the poor spring, with 285 species recorded at home; the most since 2015. As for moth of the year, it's a question of "little and large". The former is the wonderful Alabonia geofrella, known to mothers as "Geoff", a tiny, multicoloured gem that frequents hedgerows and



woodlands and flies during the day during May and June, It has a wingspan of 17-21 mm and its larvae feed under bark on rotting wood. I was lucky enough to find one on the outside window one morning.



The large moth is Convolvulus
Hawkmoth, a late summer and
autumn migrant from Europe, with a
wingspan of 10 centimetres. I've long
wanted to find this species and was
delighted when one turned up on the
front door one morning. Other
delights this year include Puss Moth,
Maiden's Blush, Cream-spot Tiger
and Drinker

This summer I did some limited trapping at Otterhead Lakes, and at Underway Meade and Sunday School Wood with the help of Lyn Osborne and Colin

Ryall. Hopefully we can increase the number of sessions next year and show some of the results to the public.

Apart from a good showing of butterflies, hoverflies and bumblebees, another star insect this year was Wool Carder Bee, a small bumblebee. It's one of the few species where the male is









larger than the female and is the only territorial bumblebee in the UK. Males will patrol favoured plants, and will chase, head-butt and wrestle rival males, sometimes even crushing them against spikes on their abdomen! Females strip woolly fibres from plants such as Lambs-ear for their nests. They are easy to identify by the yellow spots down the side of their abdomen. Well worth looking out for!

This year we acquired a trail-cam, which has been a revelation. Hedgehogs have been around all summer (right up to the time of writing); it's been quite something to see some of their behaviour, including eating, scratching and pooing!

It seems to have been a good breeding year for some of our struggling bird species; both Starling and House Sparrow have produced lots of young locally, so there have been good-size flocks around (certainly around our feeders).

House Martin numbers have been down in recent years but we were lucky enough to have a nesting pair that fledged young again in one of our

artificial nest-boxes, which are well worth installing to help the species.

The star bird in the garden has been Stock Dove, a delightful dove, midway in size between Wood-pigeon and Collared Dove, which has been regular this year. They are very wary but can be seen with patience.

A Moment in Time by John Phillips

Combe Auction Part 2

At 2.45pm on July 26^{th} 1912 the Clayhanger Cliffhanger was resolved. The gavel came down! Clayhanger Farm Lot No 63 was sold to Mr Hopkins for £2,700. Clayhanger "that desirable Dairy Farm with a stone built 4 stall stable with loft over, a range of stone built cow houses to tie 14 cows, a Wagon House Barn, Chaff and Root House etc". The Farm had 111 acres and was let to Mr JL Gooding for £127 rent pus tythes of £28 per year. The slated Farmhouse had 4-6 bedrooms and nearby an old cottage was used as Cider House to process the apples of $4\frac{1}{2}$ acres of apples into cider.

Minutes before the sale of Clayhanger the gavel came down! Lot number 62 Eleigh Water Farm sold to Mr John Madge for £3,300. The Farmhouse and numerous out buildings were very comparable to Clayhanger, and the acreage 111 acres was identical. It was rented at £167/year plus tythes of 23 to a Mr O Showers.

A further 4 farms were sold at the auction:

46 acres Lower Beetham Farm sold for £770 to Mr Wm Hurford

- Rent £36 Tythes £8.

55 acres (Higher) Beetham Farm sold for £1,250 to Mr Taylor

- Rent £54 Tythes £9.50.

190 acres Combe Hill Farm sold for £5,700 to?

- Rent £276 Tythes £36

A study of the figures are revealing. Each Farm sold for virtually exactly a multiple of 20 times the annual rent.

The change between the tythes due – fixed in the 1830s relative to the rent due in 1912 is evidence of the change in value over that period of the 6 farms sold.

For example, for Eleigh Water Farm the tythes equated to about 13% of the rent, but for Clayhanger Farm they equated to 22% of the rented value. So, for the owners, now the Ecclesiastical Commission, with a legal duty to maximise the income of the C of E, the value of Clayhanger Farm was 10% less and Eleigh Water 35% more than 75 years earlier.

Those farms, Eleigh Water and Combe Hill most suitable for Dairy Farming

with water meadows in the valley of the Isle had increased in value whilst the other 4 had barely held their value. The figures in the sale document indicate a significant reduction of arable and increase in pasture over 75 years. This reflects the national trend of an increase in specialization in farming brought about by better transport especially the steam train. The east of England increased its arable whilst the west became more pastural.

Thus the 6 Farmhouses, 2 modern 5 bed dairy houses, 6 modern cottages, 1 old style cottage with 770 acres of land sold for £18,270 on those two late July afternoons in 1912.

The remaining fields and smaller blocks of land sold for between £15 and £30 per acre apart from those desirable as potential building plots in or near Combe Village which sold for £50-£90.

Correction:

My last article in the Cloverleaf stated the sale raised £2,100. Clerical error led to a vital 4 going missing. It should have read £24,100. Sorry.
