In the Garden...with Claire at Combe Dingle Nursery

It was lovely to see so many people braving the wind at Combe Dingle for the annual spring plug plant weekend. It is always a pleasure to see everyone enjoying their tea and cake, thinking about the year ahead and swapping ideas

with friends old and new.

The main job over the next few weeks will be potting up plugs and pricking out seedlings. This year, for the first time, all of these will be potted up into peat-free compost. I have had great success seedisowing using peat-free with added John Innes. Firstly, almost fill your seed tray with compost. Flatten with an



equal firmness. This is important to ensure that all your seedlings are germinating and growing all at the same rate. The warming benches in the greenhouse are usually short of space so I often divide each tray into three. A label dividing each variety.

I rarely sow seeds without vermiculite. It is so easy to use. The amount you use will depend on the size of the seed. Vermiculite is light weight, making it easy for seedlings to push through with no risk of capping. It holds a good amount of moisture and will absorb any excess and it is sterile so damping off is greatly reduced.

People often remark that my bedding plants last for so long. For best results it is best to grow them slowly. I keep them in a polytunnel or greenhouse without any heat. If the forecast predicts 3 degrees or below then they are covered in fleece. There is quite an art to getting the fleece right which the children have mastered over the years.

By the end of March your winter pruning should be done, herbaceous plants cut down to expose emerging growth and any dividing of plants done. Now is the time to divide up snowdrops. They respond best from being moved in the green.

The ever-popular vegetable plugs will be here from 8th April. There will be the usual wide range. I like to say, 'almost any vegetable you can think of.' The variety changes throughout the season and will be here until the end of July. Every year I like to try growing something new. What will be your choice?

14 volunteers turning up to help us remove reed and silt on the only dry day that week. Four brave souls donned the waders, and apart from one over enthusiastic person who managed to trip over, all came back out reasonably dry, if a bit muddy!

The silt was pumped onto the big field where it will soon be covered by the grass and the reed roots were left near the stream edge so that any creatures that might have been removed with them could find their way safely back into the water.

The pump performed well, and the open water surface can now be seen again leaving a perfect environment for the moorhens to set up home once more. The reed will no doubt grow again but now we have the necessary equipment to keep it under control in the future, volunteers willing!

As well as working on the pond, other volunteers set to spreading the huge heap of chippings that had been donated following our request in the last issue of Cloverleaf. Fortunately, we have had more delivered since, and just in time for the Wessex Water volunteer team who will have been by the time you receive this issue.

The Wild Play area has got rather muddy underfoot in the last few weeks and the Combe Critters have had fewer meetings as a result, but hopefully with improved weather conditions it will dry out and they will be having regular sessions again soon.

Sadly we didn't receive any of the hoped-for apple trees from Thatcher's Cider, but I am pleased to say we have had some other saplings, including four wild cherry and a Judas tree, donated by some Friends of the Meade. These will provide valuable nectar and

pollen for bees and other insects as they mature, as well as some lovely spring colour.

Talking of lovely colour, the daffodils (kindly provided by Combe Dingle Nursery) and crocuses planted around the Meade have been looking splendid this year and the primroses on the mound have also been putting on a great show. Gill Wright, one of our volunteers is currently busy sowing seeds for transplanting later in the season so watch out for ragged robin, corn cockle, corn marigold and other wildflowers later in the year.

Do we want our local groups to survive?

When I arrived in Combe St. Nicholas in 2004, I was impressed by the strength of the local groups. Within a short time, Kay and I joined the Horticultural Society and, later, its committee, with me becoming Chairman.

We soon discovered why the same names kept cropping up on local group committees; a lack of volunteers. It became a problem in recent years, when local group numbers began to fall. For example, regular membership of the Horticultural Society was around 100 in 2009 but fell to 35 in 2019. To thrive, groups have to cover the costs of the village hall and hiring speakers and you need people to turn out. Before COVID, some groups struggled, but its effects might finish them off.

The Horticultural Society has lost most of its committee (not because of COVID). Without people coming forward it will end. We re-named it a Gardening Club, hoping that would give it a greater appeal. We also decided to cut the number of meeting with speakers to reduce costs and perhaps have just spring and autumn shows in the village hall, an annual cream teas and plant sale and, the big annual event, the summer show in the church. Meetings are yet to resume, because of COVID and lack of committee members.

Other groups face similar problems. Indeed I believe one of them has already been wound up. Don't think, though, that these problems affect just our parish groups; they are widespread. From my involvement in other groups outside of the Parish, I can speak with some knowledge.

Why has this been happening and what should we do? The first question may be easier to answer. Local groups have generally had an older membership. Unfortunately, as the population ages, membership numbers fall. COVID has also had a significant effect because people have got used to not turning out of an evening (when most meetings tend to take place) and may still be reluctant to turn out because of the COVID risk. Nowadays there are many ways to seek entertainment at home.

As to the second question, we must ask whether local groups serve a useful purpose now. Do they still have a value? Before social media, they helped people meet. If they are still of value, they need younger blood to survive. How can that be achieved? What will make them attractive?

Would it be a good idea for local groups to merge into one community group in the hope that something will survive? Or do we need to think outside of the box and come up with something that takes advantage of the digital age? I've asked many questions but am still struggling for answers.

We had to get the rotavator seen to again by Phil Roper at AGM. It seems it was a problem with the points caused by the very damp conditions in the shed. I do not know what we would do without his help - thanks Phil.

On the bad news side, it was reported to us by a very public minded resident of Combe that someone had deposited various panes of glass, some of which had been pushed into the ground near the steps and rail up to Green Lane. This must have been brought in from outside SSW because there is none anywhere near. This part of SSW is regularly used by children from the school as a 'safe' access to their playing field. Thank you to the person who reported it for also removing it.

On a brighter note, the wild daffodils have been fantastic, starting to bloom very early before the end of January, and still going well into March. It looks as though this display will be followed by bluebells. There is already lots of growth emerging, so it does look promising.



The wild weather has resulted in lots of scattered branches which we are gathering up otherwise they will cause problems when we need to strim later. Flower Arranging Workshops

Spring has sprung and is one of my favourite seasons for flowers - so I thought you might like these hints, tips plus a design idea.

Let's start with daffodils (Narcissus). All daffodils have a sap in their stems that is poisonous to other flowers. The best way to overcome this is to isolate them in water on their own for 24 hours. Then, discard that water and you can safely mix your daffs with other spring flowers. Daffodils should have a fresh green calyx – this is what holds the flower in place. Don't buy them if this is yellow. And remember – the sap can irritate your skin and contact with your eyes or face should be avoided.



Moving on to tulips (Tulipa). I love these as their growth is so unpredictable! The shape and length of cut tulips changes dramatically as they mature. They will twist and turn towards the light and often grow up to 4 inches higher than when you first buy them - so you may need to cut the length a few times. Here's a design idea. Once the flower is almost open, roll your thumb gently underneath each petal turning it inside out. You now have what looks like an amazing tropical flower! Then simply cut the heads off into a dish of water with floating candles. This is really easy to do – so why not have a go at creating a totally tropical arrangement?

Another moment in time... with John Phillips

In 1084 the inhabitants of Combe, Whitestaunton and Wambrook were probably cursing King Cnut of Denmark and his father-in-law, Robert Count of Flanders. Their threatened invasion of England had caused William I (The Conqueror) to decree the raising of the old Anglo-Saxon geld land tax at a rate of 6 shillings (30p) per hide. A hide was an area of land, usually between 150 and 300 acres, which had to pay the tax for the defence of the realm at the rate set by the king. 6 shillings was a considerable sum; the equivalent of 18 sheep or 12 pigs per hide.

The silver penny of circa 1.5 grams was the only coinage at the time. Whitestaunton had to pay 126 pennies (52.5 p). Combe paid 864 pennies (£3.60) and Wambrook a proportion of the 576 pennies (£2.40) owed by the large manor of Chardstock in Dorset, of which it was then a part.

The Anglo-Saxon Chronicle records William's other characteristically decisive actions. Being in Normandy at the time, he then "went to England with a larger force of mounted men and infantry, from France and Brittany, than had ever come... so that people wondered how this country could maintain all that army. And people had much oppression that year and the King had the land near the sea laid to waste". This was an early example of the scorched-earth tactic.

Each manor made its payment to the tax collector who took it to the hundred court to which the manor belonged. There it was counted (by taille) or weighed, recorded and sealed before the hundred jury. Remarkably we have the name of one of these Somerset tax collectors. The Bishop of Wells, Lord of Combe, owned circa 10% of Somerset. He paid the bulk of his tax at Congresbury hundred court. The subsequent geld inquest for the hundred records "and from one hide from which Ansger and his fellows, who collected the geld, acknowledge that they receive the money but that the King has no geld". The Bishop's tax for Combe, Chard and Winsham was paid "at the Bishop's hundred at Kingsbury episcopi". The money from Whitestaunton was sent to the hundred court at South Petherton and the money from Wambrook to the hundred court and Beaminster, Dorset.

All the money from Somerset was taken by wagon and escort to Winchester. It is recorded in the geld inquest "The King has £509 of his geld from Somerset and the men who bought it to his treasury at Winchester have had £2 for their maintenance and they paid 9sh 8d (48p) to waggoners employed and to a scribe and for coverings bought and for wax [for candles and seals]. And the King has not been paid 51sh 3d (£2.56) which the bearers of the geld have received but for which they cannot give any account. They have given security that this will be paid to the King's officers legati [lawyers]".

This shortfall, amongst many others, led the King to order further more detailed enquiries, resulting in that unique survey of England - the Doomsday Book.

Rector's Letter

We all need stories.

Stories are how we make sense of our lives. If a story is told well it will have the power to help us place ourselves within it and perhaps change our perceptions and ideas.

Stories have unexpected twists and turns. Stories find heroes and heroines in strange places. Stories reveal something about our human nature and can challenge the status quo. In stories we are drawn into the lives of characters, and we identify ourselves with this one and that one. Stories help us to empathise.

We are hearing many, many stories in the news at present coming out of Ukraine. Some will make us cry, some will make us angry and ask how this could be happening. However, we are also hearing stories of great courage, of compassion and decency. Without hearing these stories we would not be able to cope and we might fall into despair and a feeling of hopelessness.

In our Lent course this year we are reading the Book of Ruth in the Old Testament. It tells a great story. It is a story that crosses borders, a story about being 'the other' in a foreign land and is also about recognising one another first and foremost as human beings, children of God. It is about acceptance, hope and about love.

It really is a good story, and it is also short! It only has four chapters, and I would encourage you to read it.

The Book of Ruth is a very human story and in fact God is hardly mentioned. However, it does show us how we might behave if God is at work in our lives. A story of loyalty and small kindnesses which lead to growing love.

As we move into Spring and see signs of new life all around us, let us take hope and courage as our watchwords and not give in to despair. The greatest story ever told, that of Jesus, his life, death and resurrection, tells us this, just as the story of Ruth tell us, that there is always the possibility of new beginnings and new life.

I finish with the words below that we say in some of our church services:

Goodness is stronger than evil, Love is stronger than hate, Light is stronger than darkness, Truth is stronger than lies.
