In the Garden..with Claire at Combe Dingle Nursery

January can be the most important time to get out into the garden, if only to lift the spirits. It is never as grey as looks from indoors. Sure, it feels easier when it is bright and crisp than on these mild, damp, muddy days. I'd love to cut the lawn and tidy around the edges but there is a lot more winter to be had yet and who knows what it will bring. While I'm sat here, I have seen a Wren hopping in and out of the leaves left along a hedge and a Great Tit feeding from a camelia flower. It all seems rather confused. Bulbs are starting to push through and yet I have only recently put away some of my less-hardy plants, whether this is into the house or my cold glasshouse. Plants grown quite hard but healthy will withstand a lot more cold than soft weak plants. I don't like to waste resources on heating a glasshouse when there are plenty of plants to be had that are hardy and no less beautiful or interesting.

If you really don't want to go out why not repot house plants. I like to use a mixture of peat free compost, soil-based compost for substance and some perlite to hold air and moisture.

Now is a great time to get stuck into the compost heap. I am lucky enough to have 3 bays. Yesterday I removed perennial weeds from an area of the vegetable garden where I could then empty one bay. After a few repairs to the compost bin, I could then turn the compost from the second bin into the first and the third into the second. The asparagus bed still needs weeding and mulching. For years I have pruned 6 large old gooseberry bushes and always been disappointed. I don't know where they came from or the variety. This year I was ruthless and have removed them. Once my bareroot fruit bushes are here I will replace them with reliable named varieties such as Invicta and Hinnonmaki.

When it is dryer underfoot, I look forward to clearing the flower beds. I still have a lot of bulbs that I haven't got round to planting yet. They are better planted late and given a chance than not at all. They might flower late but should catch up for next year. There is pruning to be done. The rose hedge can be cut back now that the hips have gone. The wisteria will be cut back a neat framework with all the long shoots back to 2 buds. My climbing roses need tying back in and their flowering stems cut back by 2 thirds. Fruit trees should be pruned. Remembering that stone fruit trees such as plum should be pruned in leaf.

Spring is the time to think about the health of your garden. Weeding, mulching and pruning done now will pay dividends in the year ahead.

Thanks to Steve Osborne, Dave Goodall and Dave Cobbledick for getting this up and running. The new main door has been fitted and the key is in the key safe on the outside of the door. The code to access the safe has been issued to hirers and will be changed from time to time (and hirers informed, of course!) to maintain security.

Underway Meade

As mentioned in the last issue, we have now completed work on repairing the hard surface path with road planings and also improved the upper path and approach to the bridge. Thanks to Bill and Luke for doing this and also for removing an unsafe tree in the woodland. The Neroche Volunteers have created wheelchair access to the top path and in due course, when we have more wood chippings available, we will complete this work. The Volunteers also helped to install an extra drainage pipe near the rubbish bin, which will hopefully prevent some of the flooding that occurs in that area. More work to address the flooding issues will be undertaken in the future.

We will soon be welcoming a team of Wessex Water volunteers to help us with some general maintenance work, and we would very much appreciate some more chippings for them to spread. If anyone is having any trees felled and their contractor wants to dispose of the chippings, please contact me to arrange drop off.

We have recently been testing out the new pump for lowering the water level in the pond and are pleased to report that it is working well. We are planning to hold another community volunteer morning to tackle various tasks, including pond clearance, and will be looking for some brave, strong folk to venture into the pond (waders can be provided!) to help. Watch out for posters and Facebook notices for further details.

Like everyone else, times haven't been easy for your District Councillor during the last year! Every enquiry was met with difficulties mainly due to lack of staff for the various services due to COVID.

Add to this the terrible effects of the flooding last year and our services were really stretched particularly Highways who are still working on damage at Whitestaunton . We are still waiting for the overdue report from Somerset Emergency flooding Authority to see what measure may be put in place in our Parish!

I have liaised with the Parish Council on many occasions, mainly in relation to Planning and Grants, and will continue to assist them as much as possible.

As you may know the current system of District and County Councils will cease in May 2023 and be replaced with One Council for all of Somerset. There will be an election in May this year to elect the Councillors who will represent you. Combe St Nicholas will be part of Chard North Ward and elect two Councillors.

I have become a Governor of the School and was pleased to be able to help facilitate a Grant from the District Council for a running/walking track to be put in the School Playing field. This for the use of the School and outside school hours by the community.

Let's hope that encouraging signs of a lessening of the Pandemic continue and we can get back to having a healthy and Happy 2023.

Sunday School Wood

Very little to report on at the present time. We did manage to clear the roof of fallen leaves before Christmas. We also took ivy off the West wall before it started to grow into cracks and fissures, which could then cause serious damage. It is always a compromise, because the seed heads are great for birds. It is an ongoing watching brief.

When removing the leaves, we found that the downpipe from the gutter was becoming clogged, so that had to be taken off and cleaned.

As with most home lawns, the grass has continued growing due to the generally mild and wet weather, so we will have to mow it before long.

South Somerset District Council are running an initiative to provide wild flower seeds to organisations that qualify, so we have made our application to be included, and are very hopeful of being successful, so watch this space.

As mentioned last time remember to keep a lookout for the first snowdrops, and later on, other various flowers.

The Green Dragon Update

I am writing to provide you with an update on the progress we have made to date on the Save the Dragon campaign and request your help and support to build momentum in order to get the pub open and thriving once again.



We are finalising our Business Plan and will soon be sending off for Community Shares Standard Mark assessment and approval by the Co-operative and Community Capital Committee, a member group of Co-operatives UK with representatives from across the sector. The Community Shares Standard Mark is awarded to community share offers that meet national standards of good practice.

We have a number of activities taking place at the Village Hall on 26th February 2022, starting with a Coffee Morning at 11:00am, then with a Tabletop sale later in the afternoon, and culminating with a Cheese and Wine Evening Ticket Event at 7:00pm. Tickets available from any Committee member, or the Village Shop, and cost just £10 per person.

The Management Committee will be there throughout the day, to answer any of your questions, and will be open to ideas on ways to improve communication, fundraising, gathering support etc.

So far, 86 people have either pledged circa £105,000 in shares, £6,750 in donations and approx. £13,000 from fundraising and grants to date which is a great progress given the circumstances we have had to deal with. Given the Governments 2021 announcement and launching of the Community Ownership Fund last year which offers matched grant funding up to £250,000, we believe we need to raise a total of £175,000 in order to be in a position to secure £175,000 from the Community Ownership Fund and acquire the pub. This means that we are looking to raise a further £55,000 to meet this target. We are aware though that we will need to undertake some work on the pub before it can be re-opened, so ideally, we need to exceed this £55,000 by an additional £30,000 for renovations.

So, whilst we are close, we still have work to do to hit our target and we need more volunteers and more of the local community to pledge their commitment to this initiative. The Management Committee appreciate the support you have provided to date, but to make this work we need more support from each of you to help raise awareness, help attract new pledgers, or even consider increasing your own personal pledge amount.


