This was on behalf of the Parish Council and all the residents and groups in the Parish. We all will miss her and wish her well in her new venture. Thanks to Sue and Chrissie who have volunteered to take on the editorial and compilation of the Cloverleaf magazine for the future.

The recent Storm Ciaran luckily passed with few incidents in the Parish, compared with other communities. Our Flood Resilience Team is putting the final information notices together before launching a Public Meeting in the Village Hall. The meeting originally arranged for Friday 8th December has been postponed until Friday 26th January. Everyone is very welcome, regardless of whether you have been subjected to any flooding problem, as all types of possible resilience will be covered (e.g. - the recent Covid restrictions and how everyone was affected.)

At the recent Somerset Prepared meeting Rob Grimmond, Chairman of the Resilience Group, accepted an award on behalf of Rev. Deborah Perreau for all her extra work keeping residents informed and helping with as much information as possible.

It has been very noticeable lately that some vehicles are being parked in places that make it almost impossible for emergency or even slightly larger vehicles to be able to get through. Please be considerate – they may even be trying to get to you in an emergency.

The Victorian lamp-post, seats on The Lawns, the slide etc. have all recently been painted. Thanks to Craig and also Alex who recently repainted the telephone box. Thanks also to Evie and Mick for supplying the plants on The Green and looking after them all summer. They certainly cheered up the area. A new goal-post will be purchased for The Lawns as one of the current ones has a part missing.

The weather has had an impact on the of growth of hedges etc. If yours is close to the highway please ensure it is cut back and any trimmings cleared away. If any leaves etc. are covering the drains near you and it is safe to do so, please help future flooding problems by keeping those drains clear.

Please wear bright clothes if possible, fluorescent strips/jackets, carry a torch so that you can see (and to clear up after your dog!!) and use fluorescent coats/collars for any dogs/horses too. Wildlife in Your Garden with Colin Ryall

The idea behind this article is to highlight what you can do to encourage and support wildlife in your garden at this time of year and what wildlife to look out for in the garden. Autumn and winter are of course quieter for wildlife but there is still plenty to see and it's the best time for creating and managing ponds, hedges, wildflower meadows, nectar garden, planting trees and shrubs etc.

What to look out for

Five species of thrush could possibly be in our gardens now. As the glut of wild berries comes to an end our Blackbirds are returning, numbers swollen by those from colder parts of UK plus migrants from abroad. If you have a berry bush, Song and Mistle Thrushes, and migrant Redwings and Fieldfares may also turn up. Other birds commoner in winter include Siskins, Lesser Redpolls and Bramblings. On warm sunny days you might see one of the butterfly species which overwinter as adults eg. Red Admirals, Small Tortoiseshells or Peacocks, and perhaps big Buff-tailed Bumblebee queens may be active. Various species of moth are active during winter, names often give this away: November Moth, Winter Moth, December Moth. There are plenty of grassland fungi out now too, some Waxcaps are vividly coloured. Flowers may also be seen; Butterbur, White Dead Nettle, Snowdrops and Red Campion often gives a late flush.

Things to do

Rake leaves off a wildflower meadow where low nutrients is the secret to getting more flowers and less dominant grass. Move them to other areas where worm-rich lawn is great for birds and other animals to feed. Mounding leaves to rot in damp corners provides shelter for all sorts. Think of fallen leaves as a resource not a nuisance that needs to be disposed of; move them to places where they'll be beneficial.

It's worth mentioning Yellow Rattle at this point. As a hemi-parasite of some grasses; it doesn't kill the grass but reduces its vigour until the rattle seeds and dies down in July and August. That gives other flower species a chance to get going in spring and summer. If you want to introduce Yellow Rattle and other meadow flowers, NOW is the time to sow them so that the seeds get chilled by the frost.

Because plants and some wildlife are dormant at this season, winter is the best time for jobs around the garden for wildlife: pond creation/maintenance, planting berry bushes and hedges, dead-hedging. On the other hand, leave "tidying up" borders, hedge cutting, picking up

windfall apples until late winter so birds can feed, mammals and insects may be sheltering in the dead plant material.

If you feed the birds, now is the time to be feeding fats to help youngsters particularly to get through the cold spells.

Wildlife Plant of the Month – IVY is much maligned but is a wonderful resource for wildlife. It produces autumn nectar, a boon to late butterflies, bees and other insects, early black berries for birds particularly loved by Blackcaps, their leaves are food for caterpillars of Holly Blue and various moths, and dense evergreen cover where Wrens can find spiders even in mid winter. *Colin Ryall*

Tower Captain Retires

Denis Rockett has recently stepped down after 30 years as Wambrook Bell Tower Captain.

Friends and colleagues joined him for coffee and cake, where he was presented with an engraved hand bell.

The Rev Georgina Vye thanked Denis and conferred on him Tower Captain Emeritus, presenting him with an original framed drawing of The Church of St Mary the Virgin, Wambrook.

Denis attended Wambrook school and was only 12 years old when he began to learn bell ringing under Stanley Huish. After 3 months he was proficient enough to ring regularly for church services. His father served as church warden for 20 years and Denis remembers him lifting the aisle grate to light the boiler under the floor to provide heat, sometimes resulting in a church full of smoke!

Denis left school at 15; he would get up at 5am to help his father milk 30 cows then go to his building job until 5pm then milk the cows again. Denis became tower captain in 1994 and has taught many people the art of bell ringing. He has rung the bells of Crewkerne, Buckland St Mary, Ashill, Broadway, Combe St Nicholas and Whitestaunton.

Denis raises beef cattle on his 95 acres in Wambrook and grows a Miscanthus grass crop which is used for bio energy production.



A Moment in Time with John Phillips

The census of 1841 records that a well digger John Truscott lived in Combe. He was not recorded in the 1851 census when if alive he would have been 70 years old. In the intervening 10 years dozens of families had left our parishes for the city or foreign lands so demand for new wells much reduced. Digging a well was an expensive and skilled operation. One dug in another county cost £112 in 1895. That sum could have bought 2 small cottages by the Green in Combe at that date. The wage of a day labourer being 75p for a 72-hour week. The services of a water diviner were invariably required and good ones could not only indicate the depth at which the water source lay but also its abundance. All done with a forked hazel twig held gently in the hands. Remarkable! As late as 1926 the services of the water diviner John Smith were called upon by the borough surveyor Mr. P H Webb to help solve "Chard's water crisis". £9,000 had previously been spent on drilling a large number of un-productive bore holes.
